

Safety Matters



At Hill View School, the safety of you, the children, is our first priority.

Everyone has the right to feel safe.

To make sure Hill View is a safe place for you to learn and play in, we will:

- *make sure all the adults who work with you know how to keep you safe*
- *check the school regularly to make sure it is safe*
- *check who everyone is that visits the school*
- *listen to you when you have worries or are frightened. (You can ask to talk to any adult you choose if you want to share something with them.)*
- *tell Mrs Ferens or Mrs Gould if we think you are not safe. (It is a very important part of their job to make sure all the children at Hill View are safe. They may tell someone else if they think you need help or are not safe.)*
- *check where you are if you don't come to school and no one has called us to tell us where you are*
- *teach you ways to help keep yourself safe including on the internet*

To make sure Hill View is a safe place for you to learn and play in, you must:

- *follow the Golden Rules:*
 - *be gentle*
 - *be kind and helpful*
 - *look after property*
 - *listen to people*
 - *work hard*
 - *be honest*
- *play carefully and gently with your friends*
- *tell an adult if you are worried or frightened about anything or do not feel safe. (You can talk to an adult about how you feel out of school as well as in school.)*
- *only go onto websites your teachers show you and tell an adult if you see something which makes you feel uncomfortable*
- *understand and follow the 'Keeping Safe' ICT rules*
- *eat your snack and your lunch every day*
- *tell an adult if you see someone in school who you don't know*
- *always tell an adult where you are going during the day*
- *never leave the school on your own or with someone you didn't know was collecting you*
